Re: High performance learning at Caroline Chisholm School

I am writing to you on behalf of the teaching and learning team at Caroline Chisholm School to further elaborate on our high-performing learning philosophy, which was introduced during our open evening presentation in September. Since 2021, Caroline Chisholm School has proudly held the title of an HPL World Class School. Our curriculum, pastoral programme, and extra-curricular offerings are all imbued with the principles of High-Performance Learning skills and competencies.

Recent neurological and psychological research has revealed that the potential for high levels of performance is not limited to a select few "gifted and talented" individuals. Rather, the majority of children are capable of reaching such heights given the right support and environment. At Caroline Chisholm School, we are committed to leveraging this research to inform our teaching practices and cultivate high-performance learners among all our students.

Central to our approach is the belief that every child possesses the potential for success. While the journey may vary in duration for each individual, we firmly believe that with the appropriate opportunities, support, motivation, and practice, all our students can achieve their goals. Success, to us, extends beyond academic achievement; it encompasses the ability of each student to thrive socially and academically in the next stage of their lives. By the time our students complete their learning journey at Caroline Chisholm School, they will possess the skills and qualifications necessary to transition to the next phase of their careers and become world-ready global citizens.

As your child embarks on their journey with us in Year 7, they will begin learning the values of empathy and hard work. These values, along with the process of metathinking, will be the focus of our assemblies and form time in Term 1.
