Progress leaders of Years 7-11 are responsible for organising and leading the main weekly assembly which should include a range of invited guest speakers and visitors as appropriate to the termly/weekly themes, values and other local, national and international events and festivals.

Members of the leadership team members will also lead year group assemblies on a regular basis each term. Students should be encouraged and guided in taking responsibility for leading assemblies which develops confidence and presentation skills. This may be individual student, small group or whole class/tutor group led.

House assemblies take place in the second week of each new term from Tuesday – Friday. Tuesday -Brisbane, Wednesday-Sydney, Thursday-Perth and Friday Melbourne. Heads of Houses are responsible for leading and progress leaders and senior leaders are expected to attend.

During the week other assemblies take place in age phase or tutor/class groups including 'Thought for the day/week to support the legal requirement for a daily act of collective worship (see CW Policy).

Assembly Content

Assemblies are short experiences, mainly at the beginning of the school day, which when planned and delivered effectively are a powerful tool for establishing our school vision, values and ethos and the school's provision of spiritual, moral, social and cultural education. This includes fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs (see pages 58 - 59 of the Inspection Handbook)

Assemblies are important times which bring about sense of unity and belonging where all members of our school community meet to:

- Align with the school's chosen vision and values statement which includes the celebration of achievement
- Uphold our chosen values inspired by the life of Caroline Chisholm and which include fundamental British values
- Instil the HPL values, attitudes and attributes (VAAs) which will enable all students to become high performing learners
- Share in aspects of life and learning which are of worth
- Communicate matters of significance from one generation to another.

Content may be drawn from a range of resources available which aligns with the school's vision and values as stated and over time will include:

- An invitation to active participation or observation including stories, role play, interviews
- A recognition of and response to the spiritual dimension of human experience awe and wonder
- Use of visual stimulus objects, artefacts, media, pictures etc.
- Use of aural stimulus music, singing, silence
- Words/ scripture/ ritual
- Stillness and reflection/prayer aided by symbols, music, pictures

What makes a high-quality assembly - our expectations

Assembly will start promptly at 8.50 am in Years 7-11 and 8.55 am in Years 1-6. Please arrive promptly.

The Environment

- Students should arrive promptly and enter the hall in silence to support an atmosphere of quiet reflection
- A central focus will enable students to think about and engage with theme of the assembly through thought provoking images, prompts or questions which should be visible on the screen/PP presentation
- The school's vision and values mission statement should be displayed on all assembly PPt presentations



- Music should be played as the students arrive and are seated and also as students leave the assembly hall. This also provides an opportunity for student and/or staff musicians to perform
- Please make use of a microphone as required particularly when students are speaking (microphones are available from MITIE for use on the audio system)
- At the end of assembly students will be dismissed in an orderly manner by class/tutor group and expected to leave the hall in silence, listening to the music provided.

Assembly leaders and participants

- Assembly provides an opportunity for staff leading to be an inspirational role model for participating students and staff.
- Assemblies are a great opportunity for staff to bring something of themselves and their own passions and interests to deepen staff and student relationships which in turn brings individuality and diversity to the occasion.
- An effectively planned assembly is essential to enable a meaningful experience for all involved time is limited so quality not quantity is key
- All tutors class teachers and support staff are expected to attend and participate in the assembly which demonstrates the value of this time together to students (Staff should not be using devices or doing other things during this time).
- We aim for assemblies to be engaging, participative and enjoyable occasions for pupils and staff.
- Assemblies should be inspiring and uplifting experiences. They are not the times to be filled with grumbles and endless notices. If issues need to be dealt with this should be kept to a minimum so that the main assembly content is delivered.

The use of reflection

- Reflection is the period of time of silent sitting in every assembly where students and staff are asked to be still and simply be which in our busy lives and school setting is a precious opportunity.
- Reflection which includes prayer is concerned with developing spirituality -the inner personal world of thoughts, feelings and emotions.

Arrangements for Assembly under COVID safety measures 2020-21

Assembly Organisation Years 7-11 and Year 12&13

- Due to COVID safety measures assemblies will not be held in the assembly hall.
- Due to current timetable constraints, it has not been possible to hold assembly at the start of the school day.
- Assembly will be recorded each week with the expectation that students will engage in watching their year group assembly as part of their homework.
- Assembly will be led and recorded by Progress Leaders.
- Members of the Leadership Team will support Progress Leaders by either providing a recorded assembly messages for Y7-13 assemblies, which PLs can include in their assembly or record the assembly together with PLs. LT APs, VPs and the Principal will also lead recorded assemblies for year groups.

Assembly Organisation Years 1-6

- Due to COVID safety measures assemblies will be not be held in the primary hall
- Primary assembly will be held at 9.15 am on Monday and Tuesday mornings for Years 1-6. Picture News Assembly (currents affairs) will run weekly for all classes led by class teachers.
- This will be a live event on MS Teams led by the Vice Principal –KP. All children and staff will participate in assembly.
- Primary assembly will also be held at 9.15 am on a Tuesday by the Assistant Principal –NC. All classes will participate in assembly.

 It may be necessary to makes changes to the schedule if urgent priorities arise for different year groups from time to time.

This assembly explores how to be respectful of other people's abilities alongside the obligation to respond truthfully. The value of Respect provides an obligation to respond truthfully to other people, with due regard to their dignity as a human being. This assembly enables pupils to weigh when it is appropriate to speak truthfully even when there is a risk of hurting someone's feelings. Equality: We live in a world and community full of difference and diversity, whether this is through ethnicity, gender, gender identity, ability, age, religion or sexual orientation. The Equalities Act of 2010 defines equality as ensuring individuals or groups of individuals are treated fairly and equally and no less favourably, specific to their needs, including areas of **race**, **gender**, **disability**, **religion or belief**, **sexual orientation and age**. Promoting equality should remove discrimination in all the aforementioned areas. **Bullying**, **harassment or victimisation are also considered as equality and diversity issues**. We want to prepare our children and young people for life in Britain where society is diverse and we want them to embrace difference with empathy and understanding. Before exploring and developing an understanding of equality, it is important to establish a secure sense of personal identity and an understanding that individual differences are to be celebrated - each person is unique, special and of great value.

Tolerance: Tolerance means accepting difference. It is a fair attitude towards those whose opinions, beliefs, practices, racial or ethnic origins, etc. differ from our own. It means accepting that we live in a world where there is diversity and difference, and that this is a good thing.

Fairness Treating people 'equally' and 'fairly' are not the same thing. Fairness is not necessarily about having the same as others. As each individual is different and has different needs, fairness is about ensuring that a person has what they need to thrive and succeed. Fairness is closely aligned to personal justice and social justice which is central to the equalities act.

HPL VAA Empathetic – Concerned for Society This term we will focus on being Concerned for Society which is defined as the ability to know the contribution you can make to society to the benefit of those less fortunate; to demonstrate citizenship and a sense of community ethos and recognise differences as well as similarities between people and peoples; be aware of your own and others' cultural heritage and be sensitive to the ethical and moral issues raised by students.
