

Subject	Method of Assessment
Art	Visual Art students will be marked on their coursework only, which will account for 100% of their A level. Students will be off timetable on Tuesday 25 th May - Thursday 27 th May to complete their final outcomes for their Year 13 Coursework. The final deadline for all their Coursework, which includes their electronic PowerPoint of all their work, is Friday 11 th June. We will hold an extra coursework catch up session in the holiday on Tuesday 1 st June (letters were sent to parents separately regarding this).
Biology	There will be 2 Further Assessments and each assessment will be 1 hour in length. The exam papers have been produced using a range of questions from the Further Assessment papers, which have been produced by the exam board. These questions/papers will become publicly available from Monday the 19 th of April (Pearson website). Students should continue to refer to their A Level Biology Team wall for the latest information about the further assessments. Furthermore, students have been given a list of the topics which will be assessed, and they can find this on their Team wall. I can confirm that the dates for the Further Assessments in A Level Biology are the 17 th and 18 th of May.
Business Studies	Students will have assessments, which have been compiled from the exam board. They will sit units 1-9.
Chemistry	In A Level Chemistry there will be 2 Further Assessments and each assessment will be 1 hour in length. The exam papers have been produced using a range of questions from the Further Assessment papers produced by the exam board. These questions/papers will become publicly available from Monday the 19 th of April (Pearson website). Students should continue to refer to their Science Team wall for the latest information about the further assessments. Furthermore, students have been given a list of topics which could/will be assessed, and they can find this on their Science Team wall. The dates for the Further Assessments in A Level Chemistry are the 10 th and the 12 th of May. Students should refer to their Teams group for further revision guidance and there will be tabs for online resources which are available to students. It is essential that students practice past exam papers, as the Further Assessments contain past exam paper questions.
Computer Science	A series of 4 assessments over the next term. OCR have past papers and materials on their website. Students also have access to various online revision platforms which they are aware of. Subject	Method of Assessment
Drama and Theatre Studies	60% of TAG evidence based on NEA completed before the Easter holidays 40% of TAG evidence based on written assessments covering 'Hedda Gabler' and 'Saved'. Students will be sitting the two texts separately and will have time in lessons preparing and revising the text about to be sat. Past papers are available on Teams and the exam board website.
Economics	Students will sit three assessments, compiled using the materials from AQA. They are Economic methodology and price determination, market mechanism and market failure and finally, the international economy.
English Literature & English Language and Literature (both A level not AS)	English, both Literature and Language and Literature, will be assessed in the same way: Final assessment tasks - one per week, using the exam board assessment materials, which the exam boards will publish online. These cover all areas of the course and give students another chance to show what they can achieve; Previous PPE results; these will also form part of our tier one evidence; NEA results, this is worth 20%, and is also tier one evidence; Y13 graded essays: performance in other previous assessed class work will form part of our tier two evidence; Other classwork will also be considered if needed to provide a considered holistic view.
Geography	Students will sit 6 short (single topic) exam questions to cover all the topic content. Students should have submit their NEA by 15/4/21 and teachers will advise where to access revision materials.
Government and Politics	Written assessment from across both years of the A level plus evidence from three mini assessments that students will complete this month. The course was finished in lockdown and students have been working on revision since February, during the course of revision sessions we have gone through a series of past paper questions on electoral systems, UK constitution, US Supreme Court and the Presidency. As students covered all of the material for the 3 rd module of the course (political ideologies) in lockdown they will be completing their mini assessment for ideologies as an open book assessment.
History	Students will sit 6 (single topic) exam questions to cover all the assessment objectives: 2 essays for France in Revolution; 2 essays for Stuarts; 1 Extract Question; 1 Source Question; NEA submitted by 16/4/21. Teachers may also use prior work to support grading specially to show where a student has consistently been working at a particular level. Teacher will provide details regarding revision and the timings of these assessments.
Law	Students will sit assessments on the following: 1) Criminal Assessment (45 mins) (Murder, Loss of Control, Diminished Responsibility R and Self Defence); Human Rights Viva (Interview) Article 6 (Right to a fair trial) and Human Rights Act 1998 - Week beginning 3 rd May; Open book assessment (Human Rights) Articles 8 and 10; Research Project (Miscarriages of Justice) Due in by Friday 28 th May.

London Institute of Banking and Finance - Diploma in Financial Studies	<p>All Year 13 Financial Studies students will be assessed for Unit 4 Sustainability of the Financial Services System (to replace the exams that would have been sat in May) via assessments to be sat in lessons and those students who did not sit the Unit 3 Sustainability of an Individual's Finances exams in January (and those who would have opted to resit in March) will be assessed for Unit 3 by completing assessments in lessons. All Year 13 Finance students should be revising the contents of the white Unit 4 book in detail and using the revision guide that has been provided. Students who are also being assessed for Unit 3 also need to be revising the white Unit 3 textbook and using the revision guide and materials previously supplied for preparation for Unit 3.</p>
London Institute of Banking and Finance Year 12 Certificate in Financial Studies	<p>All Year 12 Financial Studies students will be assessed for Unit 2 Financial Capability for the Medium and Long Term (to replace the exams that would have been sat in May) and those students who did not sit the Unit 1 Financial Capability for the Immediate and Short Term exams in January (and those who would have opted to resit in March) will be assessed for Unit 1 by completing assessments in lessons. Year 12 students should all be revising the content of the white Unit 2 book carefully and using the Unit 2 revision guide that has been supplied and the resources on Teams and the MyLIBF website. Students who are also being assessed for Unit 1 should also be revising the contents of the Unit 1 book and using the revision resources that were supplied in December (such as the revision guide and the mind maps).</p>
Maths and Further Maths	<p>Students will sit a series of short tests based upon existing past exam papers. Enough time will be given to students to ensure that they are able to complete the papers. We are creating targeted revision papers for each of the papers they are sitting and are giving lists of what is covered by each paper.</p>
OCR Cambridge Technical Level 3 Introductory Diploma in Information Technologies	<p>The overall qualification grade will a teacher assessed grade comprising results from the 2 examined units studied in Year 12 and the coursework units completed in Year 13: Examined: Unit 1 in January 2020 Unit 2 in May 2020 - a teacher assessed grade will be applied for this unit unless students chose to resit in January 2021. The teacher assessed grade will be based on their Unit 1 result and end of topic tests completed from January to March 2020. The three coursework units have been completed in Year 13 by all students. These will be marked and contribute to the overall grade.</p>

Subject	Method of Assessment
Physical Education	We will be using a range of evidence to ensure we accurately award a grade using the attached JCQ grade descriptors. In A level PE the following aspects will be used as evidence: Performance Analysis and Performance Development Plan (Coursework); Practical Performance (Student evidence provided in one chosen activity); Additional topic-based assessments over the next few weeks. Topic 3 Wed 21 st April; Topic 1 – Fri 7 th May; Topic 5- Tues 18 th May; Topic 2 – Fri 28 th May.
Physics	Students will sit a series of 5 papers 1hr 15minutes each over the course of the next 6 weeks. The topics that will be covered are Particle Physics and Waves- Tues 13 th April; Mechanics – Mon 19 th April; Electricity Thermal and Further Mechanics - Mon 26 th April; Field Tues 4 th May; Synoptic paper – Mon 10 th May.
Psychology	In Psychology students will completing: An 'open book' timed essay on schizophrenia. A 40-minute exam assessment on Gender and Issues & Debates. A Paper 3 Project on a topic and title of their own choosing. This will be assessed on submission of an essay and presentation/verbal Q&A. A one hour written assessment on the core topic of Research Methods. Most upcoming lesson time will be dedicated to revision and preparation. Students have access to a wide range of supporting resources, including: > Topic booklets > Online Textbook (which includes sample exam questions and answers) > Past Papers and Mark Schemes > Video tutorials online ('Tutor2U').
Sociology 7192	Students will be completing two lessons of revision on the following substantial topics in Sociology: Education, Research Methods, Families and Households, Crime and Beliefs. Students will be given the assessment materials in the form of pre-release to prepare a plan for their answer (this should be no more than one side of A4), and the students' response will then be written under timed conditions during their Sociology lesson. Revision will be completed in lessons but preparation on the pre-release question is expected to be completed independently. The assessed work will be marked in line with examination mark schemes.
