Appeals for Sixth Form places can only be heard <u>after GCSE</u> results
are confirmed. This means you may miss the first few weeks of the school year. There will therefore
be a certain amount of catch up work you will be required to do as soon as possible after admission
if your appeal is successful.

On results day

You will have details of how to obtain and return our appeals form with the letter sent on results day. If you no longer have this, please <u>click here</u> to visit our website where you will find relevant forms and information. The appeal form will need to be completed and returned together with supporting documents via the link contained in the page mentioned above.

Appeals must be lodged within 20 school days of your receiving a letter declining a place in Sixth Form.

- Appeals are heard by an independent appeals panel within 30 school days of notification of exam results. You will be notified of the date, time and location of the appeal hearing 10 school days in advance (you may waive the right to 10 days notice of the appeal if you wish).
- Evidence in support of your appeal must be submitted AT LEAST 10 working days in advance of the hearing date.
- Papers are circulated before the hearing.
- Decision letters are sent 5 working days after the panel has made its decision.
