Principal's Update

As we approach Christmas, it is hard not to get caught up in the festivities and want to celebrate with our friends, but it is still important that we keep reminding our students that social distancing measures must still be adhered to, especially in the coming weeks. I am delighted however that, as a school, we are doing extremely well in managing our new environment.

Pre Public Examinations (PPEs) are currently underway for our Year 11 pupils in their chosen GCSE subjects. There has been a huge amount of planning and preparation, particularly in light of Covid-19 arrangements and seating plans and I'd like to say a special well done to all staff and students concerned. Their hard work and determination in continuing to adapt to the new way of life due to COVID-19 has been remarkable.

This year, pupils in our Early Years' Foundation Stage will still be able to star in their own production - Nativity 2020! We will be pre-recording this and sharing with our Foundation Stage parents to watch in the comfort of their own homes in December.

Free School Meals

During these really difficult times, we are aware that lots of families' circumstances have changed dramatically. If you have found that you are suddenly, or currently, in need of financial support then please do remember that you may be eligible to apply for Free School Meals (FSM) for your child. Not only will this ensure that they receive a meal each day in school, but the school will also receive a small extra pot of money ("pupil premium") that can be directly used to support your child with resources and equipment.

We are also working with a local charity who is offering food parcels to families, please contact our Lead Learner team via LLTeam@ccs.northants.sch.uk to discuss receiving a food parcel; or if you have any general questions in respect of pupil premium for your child.



Reminders

Please can we remind you that all students in Year 7 and above are required to wear face coverings whilst moving around indoors, such as corridors and communal areas where social distancing is difficult to maintain, unless they are exempt for medical reasons and are wearing an orange lanyard.

Face masks should also be worn at all times outside, with the exception of when consuming food or drink during break and lunchtime. This includes, for the avoidance of doubt, when the students are outside in the 'street' area during breaks and lessons, and not consuming food or drink, and also to students studying in groups in the Sixth Form centre, unless facing forward. **Please can we ask you to reinforce this with your children.**

Please can we also ask students to bring a small bag to school to place their mask in when not being worn. For any students using a disposable mask, we would ask that they carry a spare in case theirs becomes lost or damaged during the day.

We would like to continue to celebrate the successes of our students, both inside and out of the classroom. Below you will find a variety of positive feedback for students that our staff have put forward for recognition.



w/c 7 th Dec 2020	S AALTING	Precision The ability to work effectively within the rules of a domain'
w/c 14 th Dec 2020	CREATING	Flexible Thinking 'The ability to abandon one idea for a superior one or generate multiple solutions'

What can you do to help? Here are a few starting points:

- How do we deal with failure? Discuss a time you 'failed'. How has that experience
 influenced your present and future? Can your child identify a time they developed as a
 person due to an experience of 'failure'?
- Can your child follow a recipe independently and precisely? (Maybe they could cook dinner for the family and demonstrate their 'Empathy' skills too. Please send photos of any meals prepared by students. We would love to see the results of their efforts.)
- Set your child a challenge. For example, can they find alternative ideas for wrapping gifts. (This could be for any celebration or just for being kind!) The idea they have to abandon is: they can't use wrapping paper!

Teaching and Learning

Foundation Stage, KS1&2 updates

All Things That Sparkle

In Foundation Stage, the children have started their new learning theme 'All Things That Sparkle'. They have started to learn about different cultures and celebrations including Diwali and Remembrance. They created their own firework pictures where they explored different colours and patterns; this was accompanied with writing words to describe fireworks. Our loft area has been transformed into a spaceship which encourages imagination and collaborative play.





In our maths learning the children have been practicing their number recognition with teen numbers and created a number rocket to show their understanding of the order of the numbers. They also worked out what one more and one less would be.

The children have also enjoyed making their very own Diva lamps from clay. We talked about the texture of the clay and how it would change when it had dried out. The children thought carefully about the colours and patterns for their design and placed a tea light in the middle of their lamp ready to take home.













Coconut bird feeders - Year 2

Year 2 pupils have recently hung coconut bird feeders in the nature area of our primary playground. They worked very well in groups to work out the best places to hang the feeders for optimum use by our wildlife.





Poppy stones - Year 2

In Year 2, our pupils have been showcasing their 'Creating' ACP characteristics during a recent Art lesson. They were tasked with painting poppies onto stones they had collected to celebrate Remembrance Day.







Victorian Day – Year 1

Our Year 1 pupils recently enjoyed a Victorian Day as part of their learning theme 'Way Back When'. The children got to take part in various role-playing activities and themed lessons throughout the day and immersed themselves in the Victorian time period.

Both pupils and teachers got to dress up in Victorian clothing and re-enacted the era! It was lovely to see the variety of costumes.







Art & Design

Year 7 Textiles - Influenced by cells

Our Year 7 students have recently completed textile pieces which have been influenced by cells. 

















Biomimicry influenced lamps

Student's in Year 9 have recently been tasked with creating Biomimicry lamps as part of their Design Technology lesson - and their final designs have been brilliant! Pictured below is just a handful of their brilliant work from 9JKI, 9EU and 9MCH:





Year 10 GCSE Food Preparation and Nutrition

The group have been learning about the food science behind the use of protein in a range of cooked dishes. They have explored the use of gluten to make bread and then applied this knowledge to bake their own flavoured bread recipes. As this was their first independent practical, they had to identify their own ingredients list, ensure that it could be prepared, proved and baked within a 2 hour lesson and leave enough time to wash up and put everything away. In true Bake Off style, at least half of the group were organised enough to have a practice run at home prior to the lesson!

It is an understatement to say that I was impressed with the outcomes; the room, corridor and D block all smelled amazing for the remainder of the day (much better than 22 students cooking fish pie) and the range of breads created were fit for a bakery.

Keep up the great work Y10 - I cannot wait to see how your skills develop into Y11 - Miss Horton.





Modern Foreign Languages

All 157 of our Year 10 MFL students recently took part in the VocabExpress League of Champions competition, which we run as both a house competition for KS4 as well as interclass, and our students certainly rose to the challenge!

Our students amassed 532,135 points (200,000 more than our last attempt) between them, placing us as the **2nd Best School in the World for learning all languages** (up from 11th in 2017), **4th for French, 2nd for Spanish** and on our debut in the German competition, **NUMBER 1 IN THE WORLD FOR GERMAN!**

The students have been taking part in the competition in their own time at home and during break and lunchtime.

We are all extremely proud of the effort from all of our linguistic students!

Performing Arts

Year 11 Drama

Our Year 11 Drama students have been working on their C1 Devised performance pieces since September and w/c 9th and 16th of November performed them to an audience, whilst Mrs Atherton and Mr Holt examine them and record their work for moderation. They have researched, created and rehearsed their work (including after school time and during half term) with real maturity, despite some Covid related challenges! So far, we've had a really entertaining and enjoyable two days and are really proud of the students who haven't performed to an audience since February!







Year 13 Drama

Our Year 13 A Level Drama group also had their practical exam during November - this is usually an externally examined component which, this year, will be assessed by the exam board on video. Five candidates performed on the day and we saw a duologues from Jim Cartwright's 'Road' and Samuel Beckett's 'Waiting for Godot' and a monologue from 'Agnes of God' by John Pielmeier.






Virtual Extra-Curricular PE
