Principal's Update

I would like to start by saying how brilliant it has been to see all of our students return on-site, and a big thank you to both parents and students for their support with our change in operations.

We are now living in a digital world more than ever and whatever our feelings are about this, it is clear that we will need to embrace it. As a school we have invested in our Digital Device Strategy, and we are looking forward to a delivery (which has unfortunately been delayed) of 1,400 Winbooks for our KS3&4 students to support their learning. We will, of course, keep you updated on this.

Safety provisions

As you will be aware, a large number of safety measures have been put in place due to COVID -19 and to limit any risk to children and staff. We would like to share with you a few of the new provisions that have recently come in to place:



Perspex screens have been installed in classrooms where children have to face each other. This will limit any spread of germs, and ultimately, act as a protective shield between students.



Safety tape has been added to the floor of all classrooms, students are asked to not cross this allocated space as this is dedicated for the use of the teacher only.





Hand sanitisers have been installed outside all classrooms and offices which are regularly inspected and topped up as necessary.

We have also installed sinks in the Street to increase and encourage regular handwashing during break times.

Reminders



Please can we remind students that all students in Year 7 and above are required to wear face coverings whilst moving around indoors, such as corridors and communal areas where social distancing is difficult to maintain, unless they are exempt for medical reasons and are wearing an orange lanyard. Face masks should also be worn at all times outside, including when travelling to and from school, with the exception of when consuming food or drink during break and lunchtime.




Updates

Environment Council

Our Environment Council are currently working on three main projects in school, to help promote and improve both our schools environment and the impact on the world around us:

Cork Project

As a team we are recycling corks to create a plant display. Cork is a natural, environmentally friendly material which biodegrades completely and can be easily recycled. We are currently planning a variety of displays what will appear around the school site.

Recycling Crisp Packets

The environment council have started a new recycling scheme to recycle as many crisp packets as a school. Seating area

In secondary phase you asked for additional seating areas, we are currently in the process of responding to this request! This is a long term project and we look forward to including the student voice in this process.





High Performance Learning

High Performance Learning – what are we focusing on over the next four weeks?

We are continuing to support and encourage our students to develop the learning skills they need to ensure maximum success. Over the next four weeks we will focus on specific Advanced Cognitive Performance Characteristics and one of the key Values, Attitudes and Attribute. If you can support your child's development of these tools for learning, that would be fantastic!

w/c 2 nd Nov 2020	LMPATHY	Collaborative 'The ability to seek out opportunities to receive responses to your work; present you own views and ideas clearly and concisely; listen to the views of others; be willing and able to work in teams; take a variety of roles and be able to evaluate your own ideas and contributions'

What can you do to help? Here are a few starting points:

- Discuss the news with your child. Can they articulate their opinion and use evidence?
- Can your child take an everyday object a spoon, a plate, a book, etc.- and come up with five original uses for that object? The more imaginative, the better.
- Discuss things your child is good at. Can they identify what they have done to help them succeed? How can they use their knowledge of this to help them succeed at other things?
- Do something collaboratively with your child; maybe: cook a meal, do some DIY, create some art, make up a story, research something. Can your child take the lead?


Foundation Stage, KS1&2 updates

We would like to share with you below some information on what your children will be learning for each year group.

Year Group	Scheme	Description
Year 7	What is Drama?	Exploring how we work in groups, learning new drama techniques and building our collaboration skills – games and new drama techniques
Year 8	Charlotte Dymond	Exploration of the true story of Charlotte Dymond who was murdered by her boyfriend, Matthew Weekes, in 1844 in Cornwall – devised work
Year 9	The Identification	Exploration of a poem about a teenager called Stephen who is injured in an explosion – devised work
Year 10	Introduction Workshops	A series of workshops (voice, movement, design and monologues) leading to some shared performance work
Year 11	Hard to Swallow – Component 3	Working on Hard to Swallow – the set text for Component 3, then moving onto practical coursework for Component 1 – Devising with Brecht

Year 10 Drama

10A drama have been collaborating on the prologue from 'Romeo and Juliet', focusing on using voices in creative ways. We started to add music, staging, torches and movement in their lessons and they were super energetic and enthusiastic!!!! This also uses ACP Linking as students are linking back to their research in different stages they completed in lockdown.







Year 11 Drama

It was lovely to see our Year 11's again in person, after months of online lessons and Nearpod activities! Tammy and Meryem were keen to demonstrate their rap/singing talents, having learnt the whole of the 'My Shot' song from 'Hamilton'!



Our three Year 11 GCSE Drama groups have been working successfully on their Component 1 Coursework Devised performances. Their starting point was a choice of either a quote "She knew that he wore his life on his skin, that his biography was written in flesh and on his bones..." or a statement, "Power's not given to you. You have to take it." They have then researched themes/issues/true stories and started to devise around this. We have been really impressed with some of their ideas!
