


#### All-through science fair






## Art & Design

#### Nativity Display



Students will now be working on preparation for their Component 3 written exam – re-visiting the National Theatre production of '*Frankenstein*' that we explored in lockdown and also their set text '*Hard to Swallow*', for the external exam on 19<sup>th</sup> March.

Due to exams and wet weather, Physical Education one week played indoor curling. Olympic themed to replicate the Olympics.


We focused on:

**Linking** - connection finding - the groups have been actively seeking out connections to this sport from other sports and how they can transfer principals and ideas.

**Meta Thinking** - strategy planning - the students are choosing appropriate approach to solve a problem and ensuring that the strategy plan chosen is successful. They have planned ways in which the strategy plan can be adapted during the game and which strategy's where the most effective.

**Analysing** - complex abs multi step problem solving - the students were using a broad range of approaches throughout the games to select the most appropriate for the problems that arose in each game.

**Realising** - speed and accuracy - the students were striving to achieve excellent levels of accuracy when reaching the target. They focused on the speed of their application and the impact they wanted to have in the game.
