Food preparation and nutrition - Year 8

Year 8 have been learning how their favourite treats can be made healthier by reducing the added sugar and increasing the fibre content. They had a great lesson recently making muffins that were sweetened with carrot, banana and honey rather than lots of free sugars, and used wholemeal flour to increase the fibre.

Some were more hesitant to believe they could be tasty, but they all finished in time to try one, and not a single complaint was heard! Well done Year 8.





Food preparation and nutrition - Year 9

The Year 9 food module has culminated in students studying staple foods from around the world. Based on their research of a country and its traditional recipes, students have each identified a dish that they wanted to cook. That's 24 students cooking 24 individual recipes based on their own step by step plan and safety notes.

The High Performance Learning (HPL) focus was on precision and speed and accuracy ensuring that each ingredient was prepared accurately to improve the presentation of the dish and achieve an evenly cooked product. They did an incredible job, and I am very proud of what they have achieved. – Mrs Horton





Visual Art update

It has been a very busy month in the Visual Art department and students have been rising to the occasion and getting involved with lots of extra-curricular activities.

We are currently working with Councillor Marlene Batson from the Parish Council on two community-based projects. The first was to help the local community commemorate Remembrance Sunday by asking all primary and Key Stage 3 students to make poppies from recycled material (such as plastic). As well as helping the local community, our students are showing their support for the COP 26 conference which recently took place in Glasgow, by using recycled materials to make an Art installation of poppies that has now been put on the fencing along Wooldale Road. The installation was made on Thursday 11 November (Armistice Day) and left in situ for the community to enjoy.





We would like to thank all the students that participated in this event (including the Sixth Form Council and Visual Art Sixth Form volunteers who helped collect and install the poppies). The array of designs for the poppies is incredible; students really were ingenious in the way they made them, and it is worth taking a closer look at the installation. The Parish Council's also shared their thanks for an amazing display!



The second project is to renovate the shelter on the recreation ground in Wootton by painting a mural on it.

Our Sixth Form Visual Art students are looking forward to the challenge and will be working on some initial designs once we have met Councillor Baston and discussed the brief. The shelter currently looks as pictured right:

We are also delighted that three of our Photography students (two Year 11 and one Year 13) have been shortlisted to attend online interviews with the Royal



Academy of Art. The interviews will take place before the end of November. The students have been set a task to create an artwork based on a given theme and must present this at interview and discuss their work with members of the Royal Academy and 19 other shortlisted students. If they are successful at interview, they will then embark on a one-year programme of study with the Royal Academy, which will include workshops with well-known contemporary artists, discussion groups, work placement opportunities and complete practical tasks, all of which can be included in their GCSE and A Level portfolios of work. The Visual Art department are currently guiding them through this process and wish them all luck.

We have started work on the stage set for this year's Performing Arts production of Nativity. Our Art technician, Maddie, has completed the designs and we are now putting them into practice. We are hopeful that the stage set will do justice to all the hard work that the Performing Arts department and their students are putting in during rehearsals.

Unfortunately, we have had to put all the Visual Art department visits on hold for the time being due to complications still caused by the pandemic. These visits are an important part of our student's overall academic experience, and this decision has not been taken lightly. In all, we have had to postpone 6 trips from Years 7-13, and we would hope to be able to reinstate them at some point soon.
