Key Information Principal's Update

We have now concluded our first proper full term back in school and I am really pleased at the way in which staff and students have settled back in. Students enthusiasm for learning is evident and we are continuing with our High Performance Learning strategy which is being incorporated into all lessons now, with a focus on a different Advanced Cognitive Performance characteristic each week.

Our Primary Phase held their first virtual Parents Evenings this week, which have been a huge success using Microsoft Teams. It provided a good opportunity for our class teachers to speak with parents, albeit virtually, which I know is a vital element that is missing at drop off and collection times. Again, a huge thank you to everyone involved in making this a success and to parents for their time (and patience) with this.

Our response to COVID-19 cases

As you will be aware, as a school, we have now had 5 confirmed COVID-19 cases amongst our secondary phase and staff. We are confident that, on taking advice from Public Health England (PHE) and the local Health Protection Team on each occasion, the risk of infection within the wider school community from these cases is minimal and that all appropriate action has been taken with regards to specific students having to self-isolate.

Thanks to our robust arrangements around bubble systems and seating plans, the number of students who have had to self-isolate due to these cases has been minimal. As a school, we are continuing to ensure our safety guidelines are followed at all times to ensure both our staff and students are kept safe.

We would ask that you continue to do your bit for our community and, in particular, remind you of the request issued by the Director of Public Health, Northamptonshire on 22 October (and shared with you Friday 23 October) to, where possible, use the end of term break as a natural 'circuit breaker'.



Reminders

Please can we remind you that all students in Year 7 and above are required to wear face coverings whilst moving around indoors, such as corridors and communal areas where social distancing is difficult to maintain, unless they are exempt for medical reasons and are wearing an orange lanyard.

Face masks should also be worn at all times outside, with the exception of when consuming food or drink during break and lunchtime. This includes, for the avoidance of doubt, when the students are outside in the 'street' area during breaks and lessons, and not consuming food or drink, and also to students studying in groups in the Sixth Form centre, unless facing forward. **Please can we ask you to reinforce this with your children.**

Please can we also ask students to bring a small bag to school to place their mask in when not being worn. For any students using a disposable mask, we would ask that they carry a spare in case theirs becomes lost or damaged during the day.






Halloween and Bonfire Night safety



Sixth Form update

Y13 Internal exams

A big well done to all our Y13 students who recently completed their internal exams this month. The students have been working hard in preparation for this set of exams with a large number of students engaging in the "Ace your exams" program from Elevate education that we purchased and hopefully the results will reflect the hard work put in by the students. The purpose of these exams was to allow the students to ascertain how they are progressing and what areas they need to focus on moving forwards along with providing staff additional evidence to formulate accurate UCAS predictions.

UCAS applications

This month saw the submission of all our early applicant UCAS applications. Early applicants are for those students who are aiming to study at Oxford or Cambridge or are applying for medicine. We held an online Alumni meeting with current year 13s and two former students who have just started Medical school, which was an excellent opportunity to learn from their success and experience . We have also welcomed a visit from an Oxford graduate twice this term, for sessions with Year 13 and Year 12 potential Oxbridge applicants, helping to inspire students to aim high.

Our early applicant students had extensive assistance from Mr. Bloor and Mrs. Ideson to help prepare these applications. We had 12 early applicants this year, and we wish them all the best in their applications. A significant amount of work has also been put in place to help support the rest of the year group with their applications. The majority of students met their form tutors this month for an academic mentoring session and, as part of this meeting, time was allocated to providing feedback on the students' personal statement. Staff are currently completing subject references with form tutors, adding the details of the students extra and supra-curricular details and collating these so when the students make their university choices and finalise their personal statements, these applications will be ready to be submitted to UCAS.



Y13 extra and supra-curricular activities

This month we were also really pleased to hold small and socially distanced assemblies (we did three to ensure the students were socially distanced) to Y12 students launching extra and supra-curricular activities. Engagement in these activities play a key part to the students developing the strength of their applications for their chosen pathway after they finish their A levels. This development of their character in addition to their academic studies plays a key role in students' success when applying to university, for a higher/degree apprenticeship or looking to go straight into employment. The details of these opportunities will be advertised to students via the year group Microsoft Teams channels.
