As I have mentioned in my previous correspondence; I have been very impressed with the way that Year 10 have started the term.

Teachers are constantly telling me that teaching Year 10 this year is a pleasure, and how impressed they are with the work that is being produced already. It's a fantastic start.

This week's focus is Analysing. "The ability to deduct, reason, seek supporting evidence". **To get the most out of Analysis:**

- Decide what you want to achieve before you start.
- Think about topics or issues in an objective and critical way.
- Identify the various arguments there are in relation to a particular issue.
- Clarify and seek to understand any points that seem confusing.
- If possible prioritise some points as being of more significance than others and create a rank order.
- Evaluate any point of view expressed to determine how strong or valid it is.
- Recognise any weaknesses or negative points that there are in the evidence or argument.
- Notice what implications there might be behind a statement or argument.
- When creating your own argument make sure your reasoning is logical and structured.
- If the way forward is not immediately obvious, break down the task into smaller pieces.
- Take your time, do not rush, and jump to conclusions!

We have been very lucky with the weather so far which is helpful with a largely outdoor curriculum offer, although it is now beginning to turn colder and more wet. With this in mind, I would like to take the opportunity to remind you of the following expectations regarding PE kit.

Students are only expected to wear PE kit to school on days when they have a timetabled PE lesson. All PE kit must be branded with a Caroline Chisholm School logo, with the only exception of the shadow stripe shorts. Any non-CCS logoed items are not permitted in lessons and your child's

PE teacher will ask for them to be removed.

Students are allowed to wear any top / base layer (of any colour) under their CCS logoed kit if they wish.
