

### Term 5 Roundup - Foundation Stage

This term has been all about our learning theme, 'Amazing Animals'. The children have been learning lots about life cycles and the differences between animals, humans and plants. As part of this theme, they have had the opportunity to see first hand the lifecycle of a caterpillar as it turns into a butterfly. The children were then able to help release them in our Forest School area. Lots of the learning has been linked to this theme; the children produced some beautiful paintings of butterflies!





Year 3 have been learning all about rainforests. They had a fabulous time drawing their own rainforests on the tables! They researched all about the animals and plants that live there, as well as finding out about why people are trying to save them!

Year 4 have certainly had a busy term, trying to squeeze in their learning before their exciting trip to York. They have enjoyed designing their own crown in a Coronation themed art activity and have been getting practical with money to work out a variety of money-related problems.























# Key Stage 1

Year 1 have been making good use of their outdoor area this term for their learning theme of 'If you go down into the woods...' as they learned all about flowers and trees. The term started with Year 1 planting their own sunflowers which have grown beautifully and been sent home for parents and children to continue nurturing.

Year 1 have also been starting to learn about money to buy fruit from their pretend fruit stand, as well as volume Another part of their maths learning has been about capacity and volume by experimenting with filling containers with water.

While part of this term has been about end of Year 2 SATs assessments, they have also done a lot of fun learning as well as part of their 'Pottering around' learning theme. They worked hard on their writing by writing a report about nocturnal animals and sharing this with the class.

In maths, the children have learned a lot about telling the time on a clock face. Ask your Year 2 child to tell you the time!









Year 5 have enjoyed using the outdoor, Forest Schools area this term for their learning. For their Sensational Start, they went on a life changing journey to a new place! They have also been focusing on fractions in maths and have been starting to work on practicing sports day activities in preparation for the big day!
