Year 10 Term 3 – A Christmas Carol

Students will study the first half of the novella:

- Dickens and the Victorian era
- Scrooge
- The history of Christmas
- Gothic and ghosts
- The importance of charity and benevolence

They will also study three poems from the AQA Power and Conflict Poetry Anthology

- My Last Duchess
- Storm on the Island
- The Emigree
- Tissue

Alongside their Literature work students will also explore AQA English Language Paper 1 and 2 using a variety of fiction and non-fiction sources.

The recommended read for this unit is: Truth be told by Sue Divin

Assessments:

- 1. Power and Conflict Poetry Comparison
- 2. A Christmas Carol exam style question.

Homework:

Students will be set a weekly Seneca task.



Year 11 Term 3 – A Christmas Carol and An Inspector Calls revision

Students will complete in depth revision of two of the key Literature texts.

Alongside their Literature work students will also explore AQA English Language Paper 1 and Paper 2 using a variety of sources.
