

## Principal's Bulletin Friday 1 March 2024



Welcome to Term 4! Although it's our shortest term this year, we're set for another busy month filled with lots of enriching learning and exciting trips on the horizon. SATs, and the GCSE and A Level exam season will soon be upon us, with the coming months dedicated to supporting our students during this crucial time.

I am pleased to share the fantastic news that our school has graduated from the Behaviour Hubs programme. Established by the Department for Education (DfE), this programme is designed to improve student behaviour through working in collaboration with other schools from across the country and sharing good practice, as well as developing new routines and structures to support students' engagement in education and their mental health and wellbeing.

In graduating from this programme, I am delighted to see that the hard work that has been put in over the last two years has been recognised and the impact of these new changes has been positive throughout the school. Staff have reported improvements to classroom behaviour, smoother transitions between lessons - thanks to our new lesson start and end routines, which have been well-received by students. Positive points are up 77% compared with last academic year, and tutors have also noted building stronger connections with their tutees.

The second round of PPEs have now concluded for our Year 11 and Year 13 students, who have once again demonstrated their hard work and preparation for these important exams. Results of these will be given to the students during the next two weeks within lesson times. Time will be dedicated for teachers to go through the papers, identify common misconceptions, provide feedback to students, and ensure that all students are clear of what is required of them as we continue our preparations for the summer exams. Reports will be sent out to parents on Friday 15 March, including each student's target grade, their "latest assessment grade" (the PPE result) and the "teacher predicted grade" which is a holistic judgement based on all assessment data gathered to date. This will be explained in greater detail in each report.

In readiness for SATs which will take place in May, next week our Year 6 children will be sitting mock SATs tests. They will have papers on Reading, Mathematics and GPS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling). These mocks will familiarise the students with the way in which the SATs tests will be administered in May and help teachers identify which key areas to focus on this term.
