

Principal's Bulletin Thursday 28 March 2024



Despite being the shortest term this academic year, it has certainly been a very busy Term 4! The last week has been jam packed with two nights of primary parents' evenings, a trip to Hunstanton and Peterborough, and a musical showcase highlighting the incredible talent from our GCSE Music students providing a wonderful end to the term, leading into the Easter break on a high.

The week began with a very early start for 130 of our Year 11 students, ready for a day trip to both Hunstanton and Peterborough as part of their Geography fieldwork. During the day, students completed an investigation into the Coastal processes operating at Hunstanton and then travelled back to Peterborough to examine the success of town centre at reviving their economy. Data collection included a range of quantitative and qualitative approaches to systematically examine both the beach and the town to see what processes are operating there and how effective they have been in shaping two very different landscapes.

The students behaved incredibly well, and even had some time to enjoy walking the pier and Peterborough high street after completing their work. I have heard first hand lots of great staff feedback, as well as the sight of wet trainers and soggy trousers from the beach. A huge thank you to all parents and staff who supported this trip.
