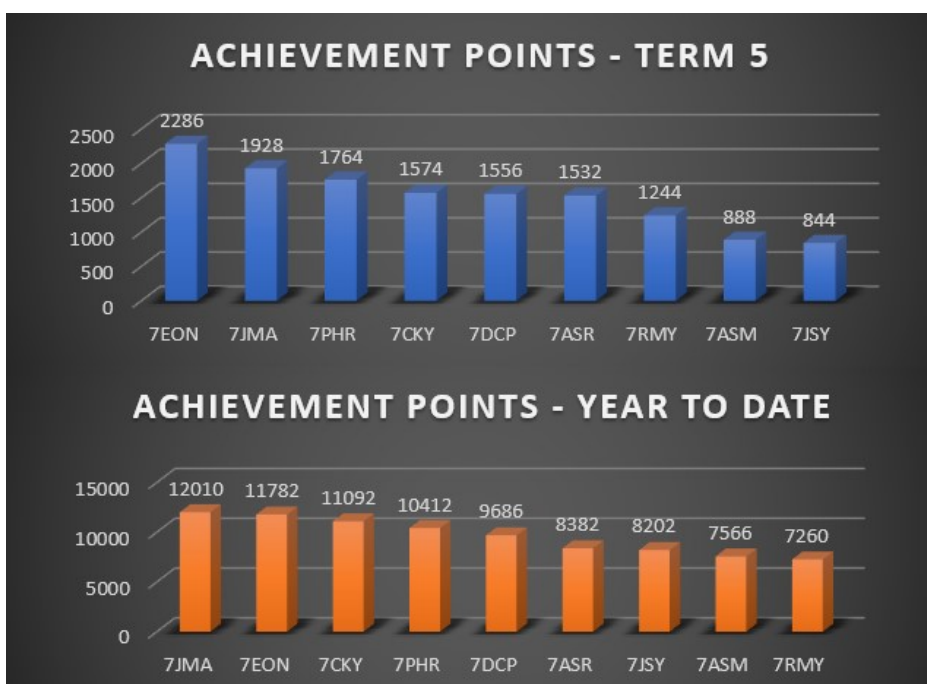

### Summer Term Uniform

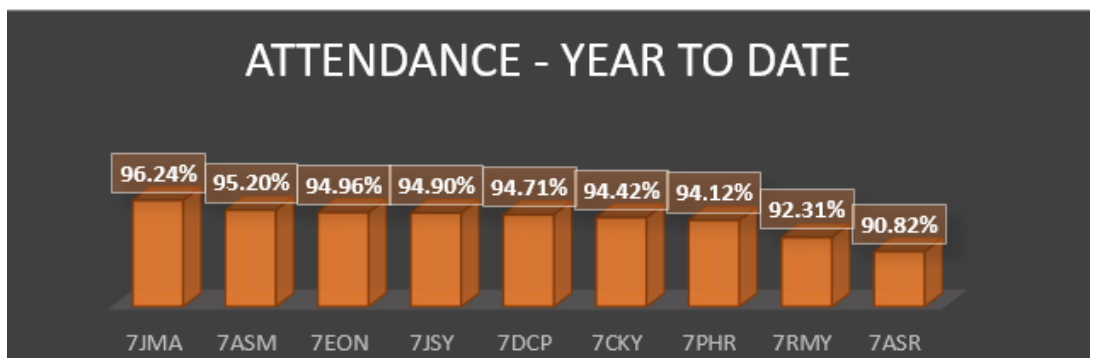
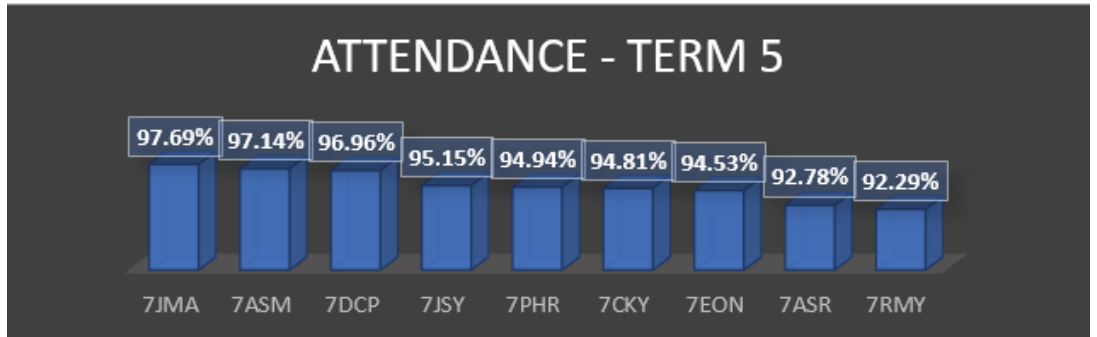
A reminder that unless you hear otherwise from Mr James, students will still be expected to bring their blazer into school every day and must be worn when transitioning between lessons.
