Dear Parents/Carers,

**Re: 'Consistency and Survey Feedback' (February 2026)**

Recently, I listened to a podcast that explored the idea that consistency, not motivation, is the foundation of success. Motivation is often the spark that gets us started, but it's consistency that keeps us moving forward. It's the day-to-day discipline and routine that ultimately fuel progress.

Many of us begin the year with resolutions, and with Lent approaching, some may be considering something to give up or take on. These moments remind us that the small, repeated actions we sustain over time are what bring meaningful change. This message connects strongly with the habits we encourage in our students. Effective exam revision isn't about lastminute effort. It's about drip feeding learning, developing routines, and practising regularly. You will have seen our recent communications about punctuality and daily routines: with family support, we are placing emphasis on these areas because they are central to student wellbeing, progress, and the smooth running of the day.

Thank you to all who responded to our recent surveys. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us continue to improve. I am delighted to share that:

- **95%** of parents and carers say their child is *happy* and *safe* at school.
- **92%** say they would recommend CCS to other families.

This is a wonderful reflection of our community, and I am always grateful for your partnership, being committed to ensuring all students are happy and feel safe in our learning environment.

You also provided helpful feedback through our recent communications survey saying you valued the 'CCS Pulse', 'CCS Chronical' and 'What's Coming up' magazines as ways of keeping you informed about what you need to know. Common themes suggested by you included:

- A clearer Assessment Calendar, so you know when to expect reports and parents' evenings.
- Refining and simplifying our other communication platforms.

We have acted on these points, and I want to update you on what is coming next.

We will soon be launching a 'one stop shop' app called '**My Child at School (MCAS)**' as a replacement for Edulink. This will become our primary method of communication with families and will help ensure that messages, reports, and updates are easier to access. We are also reducing the number of home learning platforms students currently use. To support consistent learning routines, the school is purchasing for students 'Tassomai' for English, Maths, Science, Geography, History, MFL, and Computing. Tassomai is an AI driven learning tool designed to help students strengthen knowledge through regular, low stakes practice... the very essence of consistency.

Thank you once again for your continued support. Together, by modelling and encouraging consistency, we can help students develop lifelong habits that enhance learning and wellbeing.
